School Card

For eligible families the School Card Scheme supports families with the cost of Materials and Services fees. All school card forms are now available on the sa.gov.au website. If you do not have access to a device or internet to complete your form online, please call into the front office and we can assist.

School Fees

All families should now have received their Material & Services and Swimming fees for 2020. Swimming fees must be paid prior to the commencement of lessons. Material & Services fees must be paid by the end of Term 1, Thursday 9 April, unless a signed instalment plan has been returned. Payments can be made via Cash, cheque or EFTPOS at the Front Office or electronically via Bank EFT or through the Qkr! App. Please ensure adequate references are used so that payments can be easily identified.

Swimming Lesson Information

Students in Years 3-7 participate in two weeks of lessons and Foundation-Year 2 students have one week of lessons. The dates for the lessons are:

Week 4 Feb 17 - 21 Years 3-7 and Year 2
Week 5 Feb 24 - 28 Years 3-7 and F/1 class

Lessons for all students are from 1:30-2:15pm. We will be having an earlier lunch and depart school, by bus, at approximately 1:00pm and returning to school at approximately 3:00pm during these dates. Parents collecting students from the pool must physically sign the roll sheet before taking their child. It is an expectation that all students participate in swimming lessons. Students are not permitted to bring money to purchase items from the Aquatic Centre Canteen.

If your family has a season pass to the Aquatic Centre, please contact us as this will impact on the cost of your child/children's swimming lessons.

If payment has not been received prior, students will remain at school.

Acquaintance Night: Tuesday 11 February

Acquaintance Night will provide an opportunity for families to visit their child/children's class and find out about class routines and expectations. The format for the evening is as follows:

Start of Year Requests and Reminders

Please be aware of the following information; we thank you in anticipation of your support in these matters:

- Our Front Office will be open every day this year. Charmaine Ramage, Administration, works Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday morning and Friday. Elise Chuck, Finance, works on Wednesday and Thursday.
- Please ensure all notes left at the Front Office are named and if money is included, ensure that it is in a clearly named sealed bag or envelope and handed directly to a staff member.
- Morning bell: Please be aware that the first bell will sound at 8.50am this signals that students are to make their way to the classroom and be prepared for learning by 8.55am. Parents, please be mindful of keeping the area outside classrooms free from this time. By doing so ensures a smooth start to class routines. Also, at times, there may be children who are upset when they first come to school in the morning and it is easier to transition them into classes without others being nearby. Being mindful of this request will be a positive reflection of our school value of Respect.
- Before school catch ups with staff; Staff are in their classrooms from 8.40am. This time can provide an informal opportunity for parents to catch up and chat with teachers but please be aware that they are also preparing for the day ahead. If you wish to discuss a matter, it may be more appropriate to organise a time to meet after school. Quite often, during the morning, there are other children in the class and therefore the conversation cannot be held in privacy.
- When children are absent, or there is a planned absence, please provide your child's class teacher with either a written note or submit abcense via the School Stream app. A note is also required if you need to pick up your child during the day for an appointment. Students will need to be signed in and out at the Front Office. The Department for Education requires schools to keep a record of this information so your assistance with this matter is appreciated.

Assembly Arrangements


