A WORD OF POPE FRANCIS

"In truth the Church shows her fidelity to the Holy Spirit in as much as she does not try to control or tame him. And the Church shows herself also when she rejects the temptation to look only inward. We Christians become true missionary disciples, able to challenge consciences, when we throw off our defensiveness and allow ourselves to be led by the Spirit. He is freshness, imagination and newness. Newness always makes us a bit fearful, because we feel more secure if we have everything under control, if we are the ones who build, program and plan our lives in accordance with our own ideas, our own comfort, our own preferences. This is also the case when it comes to God. Often we follow him, we accept him, but only up to a certain point. It is hard to abandon ourselves to him, allowing the Holy Spirit to be the soul and guide of our lives in every decision. We fear that God may force us to strike out on new paths and leave behind our all too narrow, closed and selfish horizons order to become open to his own".

CHURCH CAR PARK: At a recent meeting of the Parish Finance & Maintenance Committee the issue of incorrect parking was discussed. It was resolved we place this note in the bulletin to remind Parishioners not to park behind other cars, thus preventing the correctly parked vehicle from moving before the illegally parked vehicle moves. The other issue that numerous users are doing is creating car parking on the yellow lines and next to the concrete border islands thus reducing the safe driving access in the car park.
