A WORD OF POPE FRANCIS

"Jesus hands on to the disciples the prayer we call the 'Our Father', perhaps the greatest gift left to us by our divine teacher during his time on this earth. After revealing for us the mystery of himself as son and show us how to enter into this relationship – through the sense of trust and confidence of a son or daughter. What we ask for in this prayer is fully realized in the person of God's only begotten Son: the honour to God's name, the coming of the kingdom, the gift of bread, of forgiveness and of freedom from evil. As we ask, we open our hands and hearts to receive. To receive the gifts the Father has enabled us to see in the Son. This prayer is a kind of summary of every other prayer and we always pray it in communion with our sisters and brothers. If we only stop at that word 'Father' we can feel something deep in our hearts."

Liturgical Colour: Green (The colour of growing things and hope, like them, is always new and always fresh).

This Sunday is special, as young people in our Parish will be confirmed by the Archbishop. Liturgically **Confirmation is red**, signifying the Holy spirit who **confirmed** the apostles on Pentecost giving them courage to practice their faith.
